DR. JAMES YEAGER TO GIVE A SERIES OF LECTURES ON
"HISTORICAL MUSICOLOGY" AT UNM CONTINUING EDUCATION
STARTING WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 24, 2011

Our organist, Dr. James Yeager, is scheduled to give five lectures covering **Historical Musicology from 200 B.C. to 1580 A.D.** An alternate title is "**The History of Sacred Music**". ANNOUNCING 2011 - 2012 DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY CLASSES

Disciple I

Disciple: Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study is an approach to Bible study that emphasizes disciplined reading of and listening to Scripture. During the course of 34 weeks, DISCIPLE groups move through the Scriptures from Genesis to Revelation. All DISCIPLE Bible study participants will read more than 70% of the bible. The Scripture for each session follows the chronological movement of the biblical story. The group meets weekly for 2 – 2 ½ hours for 34 weeks. Each participant makes a commitment to daily preparation (30 – 45 minutes per day) and weekly attendance at and full participation in the group study sessions. DISCIPLE aims at transformation, not just information. **The class will meet on Wednesday evenings from 6:30 – 8:30 PM (times may vary slightly) beginning on August 24.** Libby Engdahl Whiteley will teach this class, with another teacher to be announced.

Disciple II

Disciple: Into the Word, Into the World gives participants the opportunity to delve deeply into four books of the Bible. The first 16 weeks are spent with Genesis and Exodus, the second 16 weeks are spent with Luke and Acts. Extra reading and spiritual disciplines are incorporated into the study. **This class will meet on Thursday evenings, beginning Thursday, September 1 from 6:30 – 8:30 PM in CE Room 220.** Teachers will be Sarah Price and Sam Mayer.

FROM A CHILD'S GARDEN

Celebrating 40 years in the Garden, from Beth Busick

A Child's Garden in the 70's

It was a tumultuous time in my life. I was a young widow who had just moved back to my home town to try to put the pieces of my life back together and move forward. My family, friends and my church played a large part in providing the support that I needed and, as it turned out, so did A Child's Garden.

One spring morning I received a phone call from GERALYN HALL (Chuck Hall's wife and a good friend of the family's). She was one of the founding mothers of ACG and was calling to tell me they were looking for a new director. She had heard that I was back in town after spending three years as the director of a private preschool in Phoenix. She urged me to come in for an interview. After meeting with a room FULL of pastors, FPC personnel members and ACG board members, I was offered the job. I signed my name on the dotted line in May of 1975 and thus began my long association with ACG.

That summer we had our work cut out for us. We needed to hire several teachers as a result of APS adding public school kindergartens. Many of the ACG teachers were tempted by the APS pay scale and who could blame them? So, along with the ACG personnel committee we began a long summer of interviews. Much to our relief, one of the first people to interview was a young, energetic woman named Amy Parkman. She had specialized in early childhood education which was rare in those days. We were so impressed that she was not only hired as a teacher but was given the job and title, Program Coordinator, which meant she monitored ACG curriculum and planned the teacher in-service trainings. We all learned so much from Amy, everything from potty-training to using self-selections in the classroom. I am pleased to say that she is still doing trainings for parents and staff from time to time and recently served on the ACG Board of Directors.

One of the teachers that did stay on that year was a young teacher and mother who was completing her classes in early childhood education. She had an easy southern drawl and a laid back personality to match. Her students adored her and her colleagues took note of her intelligent and intuitive contributions in staff meetings. Her name was Nancy Thomas. I cannot even begin to list the valuable contributions that Nancy has given to ACG, first as a teacher and as Director for so many wonderful years.

As a new Director of a large preschool I often felt tasks to be daunting but I always had the support of a very capable and inspiring group of women that made up the ACG Board. Mary Jean Jones served as chairman that year along with Sue Bowersock, Sue Campbell, JoAnn Jackson, Sandy Seligman and Kathy Yarbrough. What a dynamic group – and still are!

After a couple of years I remarried and after a couple more years we decided to adopt older children. I found it was time for me to exchange my job as ACG Director for the job of motherhood. I stayed on as a Board member for several years and found it easy to welcome the new Director – Nancy Thomas!

As I look back at those years I realize just how profoundly my life was shaped by these knowledgeable, confident women and by the experiences I had as the ACG Director. I am most grateful and feel extremely lucky to call these women my friends to this day.

My association with ACG continued, this time as a grandmother. Two of my grandchildren Gabriel and Alyssa Montano attended. At that time, I worked upstairs for the church and could watch them on the playground from my office window and run down and spend time with

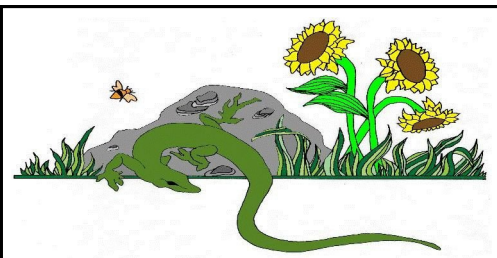
