A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

Dear Members,

Thus far 2011 has been a busy year for the Personnel Committee, as we were designated by the Session to be the search committee for a transitional pastor. More on that subject in a moment, but first let me tell you a few things about our regular operations.

Last year, the committee updated both its mission statement and its list of responsibilities. Our basic mission is to fulfill the Session's responsibility to provide for the administration of both ordained and employed staff for the program of the church. In fulfilling this duty we conduct annual reviews of all program staff, including the adequacy of compensation. Of course, in recent years we have not had to spend much time on the compensation issue due to the church's finances. We hope that changes in the near future. We are also charged with insuring that a concern for equal employment opportunity, fair employment practices and adequate personnel policies is demonstrated in all employment situations.

The results of our annual reviews are reported to the Session, and in the case of pastors, subsequently to the congregation at its annual meeting. Finally, we are charged to maintain the strictest confidentiality in all of these matters, unless otherwise directed by the Session.

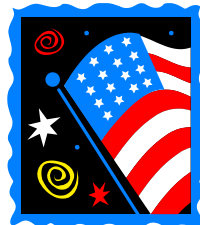

In 2010, we also adopted updates to the church's Personnel Policy Handbook. Some of the changes were merely long overdue "cleanup" of language, but we adopted substantive changes that brought us more in line with current policies in churches and other organizations. These changes related to the use of illegal/controlled substances and computer/internet use in the workplace.

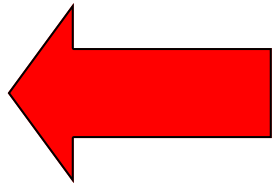


INDEPENDENCE DAY SERVICE AND PICNIC

The national church has changed its mind on a number of divisive issues in the past, including slavery, divorce, and women’s ordination. Our local church has survived and, even flourished, in times of change. We will continue to focus on the unity of our mission and ministry, and we will continue to move ahead trusting in God’s leading.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY UPDATE 2011

Dear Friends,

Once again our house went up in record time, about ten weeks. Our youth prepared lunch for all on January 29th, thanks again for the great food. I attribute most of the quick build to the fact that we didn’t build a house in 2010, and when we finally got the land, permits and all, we were ready to build. As a result I was not quick enough on the draw to sign us up for a Saturday build. My apologies, to all my volunteers for not scheduling us a day of work on this house.

The ground breaking for this year’s house was January 15th, and was dedicated on March 26th, 2011. This house marks the 155th house built by Habitat in Albuquerque. The proud new home owner is April Baca, a single mother of three. A copy of the dedication bulletin is posted on the Mission bulletin board.

This year, Habitat informed the Presbyterian - Catholic Coalition that they needed to raise the donor contribution per house from \$50,000.00 to \$75,000.00. This came as no surprise to us, but the jump is considerable. Habitat had been, for years now, absorbing the increase in the cost of each house, hence the big jump. The Coalition hasn’t decided what to do yet, but we do want to keep building home’s. So it’s obvious we need more money to build each house. This may mean that we won’t be able to build one house per year, but build one once the money is raised.

On that note, our good friends at Shepherd of the Valley have a Chile Fest fund raiser each August to raise money for the Habitat house. The all-day event features music, crafters, a book sale, bake sale, silent auction, kids’ activities, chile roasting, and more. If you would like to contribute your talents in any of the above mentioned events, Shepherd of the Valley would like to know. I’ll post contact information and such on the Mission bulletin board in the main hallway. And above all, go to the Chile Festival if you can.

NEWS FROM THE OFFICE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PC/USA

A majority of the 173 presbyteries of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) have approved a change in PC(USA) ordination standards.

At its meeting on Tuesday, May 10, 2011, the Presbytery of Twin Cities Area became the 87th presbytery to approve an amendment that will remove the constitutional requirement that all ministers, elders, and deacons live in “fidelity within the covenant of marriage between a man and a woman or chastity in singleness” (G-6.0106b in the church’s Book of Order).

The new language reads, “*Standards for ordained service reflect the church’s desire to submit joyfully to the Lordship of Jesus Christ in all aspects of life (G-1.0000). The governing body responsible for ordination and/or installation (G.14.0240; G-14.0450) shall examine each candidate’s calling, gifts, preparation, and suitability for the responsibilities of office. The examination shall include, but not be limited to, a determination of the candidate’s ability and commitment to fulfill all requirements as expressed in the constitutional questions for ordination and installation (W-4.4003). Governing bodies shall be guided by Scripture and the confessions in applying standards to individual candidates.*”

The new provision reaffirms the long-held right and responsibility of ordaining bodies (local church sessions for deacons and elders or presbyteries for ministers) to determine the suitability of each candidate for ordination. The effect of the new language also opens up the possibility that persons in same-gender relationships can be considered for ordination.

The 219th General Assembly (2010) of the PC(USA) approved Amendment 10-A last summer, but required a majority of presbyteries to ratify the provision for it to become part of the church’s Constitution.

The change will take effect July 10, 2011, one year after the adjournment of last summer’s assembly.

In response to the vote, denominational leaders issued a letter to all congregations of the PC (USA), calling the debate about ordination standards “a Presbyterian family struggle.” The letter goes on to say that Presbyterians have “sought to find that place where every congregation and every member, deacon, elder, and minister of the Word and Sacrament can share their gifts in ministry while, at the same time, the integrity of every congregation, member, deacon, elder, and minister is respected.”

Additional resources are available at the [Office of the General Assembly, www.oga.pcusa.org](http://www.oga.pcusa.org), which include a “frequently asked questions” document, liturgical resources, a video podcast by Gradye Parsons, Stated Clerk of the General Assembly, and Advisory Opinion #24 about the change to G-6.0106b.

What does the change in ordination standards mean?

The Presbyterian Church/USA has shifted authority for ordination standards from the national level to the local presbytery and session level.

Some things will not change:

A congregation will continue to have the right to choose the women and men they believe God is calling to leadership as an elder, a deacon and a minister. A presbytery will continue to have the right to choose who it will admit for membership.

A note from Sallie Watson, our Regional Presbyter regarding this change:

“There will be many in our presbytery who will rejoice and many who will be distressed by the passage of Amendment 10-A. My pastoral encouragement is for all of us to practice mutual

AN UPDATE FROM THE REV. DAVID WHITELEY, DIRECTOR OF THE RIO GRANDE FOOD PROJECT

Last year the Rio Grande Food Project distributed 212 tons of food, approximately 354,000 meals for 23,000 people. The Food Project is housed at Rio Grande Presbyterian Church, in a work space of about 350 square feet. It's hard to imagine that much food collected, stored and distributed in such a small space – its small physical size makes the Food Project even more miraculous.

The Mission Committee was surprised to learn that First Presbyterian Church is one of the Food Project's largest supporters. Last year, we donated 4,236 pounds of food and \$11,517 – the largest financial contribution received from any church.

During the first quarter of this year, the Food Project has noticed a 10% increase in the number of people served, demonstrating that the financial need in our community is unabated. This comes at a time when our Federal Government is cutting money available to communities for buying emergency food, cutting money for food stamps/SNAP, and also decreasing the availability of food commodities or free food for distribution by local food projects.

Working with the Storehouse, the Rio Grande Food Project received a one-time grant for capital improvements. The Food Project will purchase a delivery truck and install a walk-in cooler and freezer with its share of the grant. Last year, the Food Project also partnered with a non-profit community garden in Corrales, "Seed 2 Need". The garden produced 6 tons of fresh produce for distribution by the Food Project. As unemployment and poverty in Albuquerque increase, so does hunger.

First Presbyterian Church's Mission Committee is committed to supporting the Rio Grande Food Project and its Director, David Whiteley. Watch for more information regarding a new food collection campaign. Please, continue to bring in non-perishable food items to our shopping basket, located in Commons II. If you would like to volunteer your time or make a direct contribution to the Rio Grande Food Project, you may do so through their website, www.rgfp.org.

A Child's Garden

FROM A CHILD'S GARDEN

**Celebrating 40 years in the Garden, from Linda Rose,
Teacher at ACG**

I was a young mom who, before my son was born, worked as a kindergarten aide at Griegos Elementary. I remember talking to a friend about how I wanted to work part time with children but did not want to leave my son, Danny. It was then when she told me about A Child's Garden. I walked into ACG for the first time to meet Nancy Thomas and apply for a job. That was a really special day, because Nancy had just learned that ACG had passed the necessary requirements to become accredited for the first time, by the National Association for the Education of Young Children. And, ACG was the **FIRST** preschool program in New Mexico to achieve such a status. Teachers were sharing their joy with this achievement, and I thought, "What a great place to work."

I was hired to work in the infant room on Thursday afternoons when the staff met for training. The following year, 1988, I was a substitute and had experience in all the classes, learning a lot about different styles of teaching and what a wonderful place this is for children. It was true here, that everyone working together had one goal in mind: to create a happy, loving safe place for children to learn through play, while developing friendships and positive self-esteem.

Over the years, I have seen many of the children when they come back to visit, some to see teachers, some to inquire about employment, some to bring their children here. It is heart-warming to see them and see how they are doing. When Nancy retired and Susan Smith became the director, we added a kindergarten through third grade program for the summer. It is so nice to see those children again as well and learn of their new adventures.

When it was time for my son to leave ACG, I was a bit apprehensive because I knew that no matter where he would go to school, it would be tough to be as welcoming as ACG. Danny moved on many years ago, but I never could. I'm still learning something new each day from the children. Danny has been married two years now, has bought a house and has two very spoiled dogs.

I know that one day, I will have to move on, and when I do, I will always think fondly of the years here "at the Garden". Thanks to First Presbyterian Church for providing the space and for supporting the work that has made A Child's Garden a great place for children and their families to grow.
