## FROM THE FPC PROGRAM STAFF...

Dear Members and Friends of First Presbyterian Church,

We have entered that 'liminal' space, the in between time, that our Regional Presbyter, Sallie Watson, described to us last January. Paul has retired; we have begun our transition, and we wait expectantly for an interim pastor to begin his/her ministry with us. Waiting does not mean sitting still. God is doing new things in and through us; and the ministries of First Presbyterian Church flourish, as we make our summer plans.

Here's some of what's happening:

In June, four young people and I will travel to Ghost Ranch for Youth Week. We'll sing and pray and worship together, as well as hike and swim and enjoy all that Ghost Ranch has to offer. In July, our youth group will partner with St. Andrew Presbyterian Church's youth group for Three Days of Mission. We'll stay in Westminster Center at night and during the day travel around the city, working with many different community organizations. We're spending time at the Martineztown House of Neighborly Service, at the Corrales Community Garden, at the Roadrunner Food Bank and at the Rio Grande Food Project.

The Mission Committee will host two visitors from Guatemala this summer. We are honored to host a visit from Amanda Craft, a PC/USA mission co-worker on May 31-June 2. Amanda works with the Presbyterian Women of the Guatemalan Presbyterian Church; her primary tasks are leadership development and Christian Education. Watch for more information regarding her visit. We are also happy to host a visit from Samuel Espana; Samuel has been our host in Guatemala on our last two visits. He works with Saq B'e, a non-governmental organization sponsored by the Betel Presbyterian Church in the city of Quetzaltenango. Samuel will be in Albuquerque from July 1-11; be sure to greet him at our 4<sup>th</sup> of July worship service at Manual School.

Paula Wood, our Helpline & New Member Coordinator, will continue to be the staff resource person to the 42 member Board of Deacons, which is currently led by Moderator Nancy Cooper. Paula checks Helpline (764-2910) with the help of volunteers. This informs the Deacons and staff members about members in hospitals, rehab or assisted living facilities. Paula is the staff resource to the Membership Committee, led by Elder Mary Anne Meredith, and she is also a resource to the Nominating Committee, led by Elder JoAnn House. The nominating committee is working to recruit a new Class of Deacons and Elders for 2012.

On the Administrative front, this will be a busy summer for FPC. The Senior Pastor offices will be painted and spruced up prior to the arrival of our Interim Pastor. Stucco repair and painting work will be done on our rental house on Elm street. Sprinkler work will be completed in the Rose Garden. Most exciting of all will be a new roof surface on the CE building. Summer is the time that we try to get to all of those projects that never seem to get done during the busy times. Mike also has plans to lead at least one short term weekday Bible study over the summer as well.

The Summer Music Schedule will be as follows: the Chancel Choir will be singing the months of June and August; Family Choir, Bell Choir, Children's Choir, and Old Time Gospel Band will all be back in session in September.

Summer at ACG promises to be filled with activity. We will have over 100 children each of the three summer sessions and offer interim care when school is not in session. If you are in the vicinity, you might see a group of four year olds walking to the grassy hill, by Eye Associates or some kindergarten children playing in the park by the Press Club. By my fourth year, the school had really started to grow. We had added four or five more teachers and had maybe 60 to 75 children. That was the year I left, 1975. I had decided to go back to school. I finished my master's degree in 1976 and taught at APS until I retired.

It was a wonderful four years. I hadn't taught that age, that level before and it really opened my eyes to how important early childhood education is.

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## **FROM THE PERSONNEL COMMITTEE**

After Paul announced his retirement in January, the Session designated the Personnel Committee as the search committee for a Transitional Pastor. The employment of a Transitional Pastor is required by the Presbytery for several reasons, but chief among them is to allow some separation between a long-standing pastor and his /her replacement. Transitional Pastors have carefully outlined duties as specified by the Presbytery, including guiding the congregation through the evaluation and planning processes required before a search for a new permanent pastor can begin. As we have learned in the past few months, there are pastors who have made the calling of Transitional Pastor their career, and are experts at this process.

The Presbytery's Committee on Ministry appointed two people to act as liaison to our committee and guide us through this process. They have been very helpful, especially Frank Yates, Pastor at St Andrew Presbyterian. There were certain tasks that Presbytery allowed us to perform prior to Paul's departure, including the drafting of our position description. The Committee on Ministry has approved that document, and now with Paul's departure, our search has begun. The Presbytery has provided the Personal Information Forms of several qualified candidates and we are in the process of evaluating them. We will keep the congregation posted as we progress through this critical process. Keep us in your prayers! Curtis Porter, Moderator, Personnel Committee



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## **MISSION COMMITTEE NEWS:**

### FROM A CHILD'S GARDEN

**Celebrating the 40 years of A Child's Garden, Joan Parker**

**Has It Really Been 40 Years?** Oh, my, the memories.



I taught the 3-year-olds that first year of A Child's Garden. September 1971 that was. The 2-year olds were taught by Mary Higgins, who later became an attorney. Mary Lou Santiago taught the 4-year-olds. We didn't have 5-year-olds because there were already several established kindergartens in the city then.

Mary Lou had taught at Head Start. I had been an elementary school teacher but stopped to have children. I had taken an early childhood education class at Michigan State one summer. But most of us, from the church Why Mommy group, were new. We read articles on early childhood education and had speakers from UNM and elsewhere come to the group. That was our preparation.

We wanted a real pre-school. There was already a nursery, with Pauline Davis. But we wanted a school. And we decided it would be a two-day program. A Monday-Wednesday class and a Tuesday-Thursday class. Nine a.m. to noon for both.

The name *A Child's Garden* and several other names came out of the first board meeting (the board, principally made up of members of the Why Mommy group). But *A Child's Garden* stuck.

The Session gave us no money. The Finance Committee and our board decided that we would make do with what fees we got from registration.

Jane Ingebritsen was the first director. She stayed one year. Dolores Martinez took her place and she stayed there for several years. She established in-service meetings at UNM. Nancy Halbgewachs was really instrumental in getting the whole thing going. Clara Storment and Lucille Katzenberger were resource people. They let us use church equipment when we got started. You know, bulletin boards and the like.

We met in the Mitchell building, where the school is now. Every once in a while a child would wander off and go to one of the room where the Quilters met. We would find the child a lot of the times talking to the older women who were quilting.

We had maybe 45 children that first year. About half the parents belonged to the church. Over the four years I taught there I had Dana Bowersock, Jay Zanos, Jimmy Hutchison, David Hall, Charlie Hodgin, Brenda Brown and Leigh Church—all of them children of members of the church and involved in the church. Stephen Pack was in my class. He's still in the church.

I used to take my whole class on field trips. I had six children in an early class and we'd all get in my big Oldsmobile station wagon. The car had eight seats belts so everybody had a seat belt. I liked to take them to Highland Park, which is just south of the old Memorial Hospital, now a hotel. The kids loved to roll down the grassy hills there, where that old cabin is, the Albuquerque Press Club. We went to the M&J Tortilla Factory to watch them make tortillas. And we went to the State Fair and to Halloween parties and Easter parties at homes.

I remember the children used to play in the Mitchell Hall fountain. It was there given in honor of Roscoe Storment. We had Story Time—all the time.

Russell, my youngest son, was there. Todd, my middle son, was there. We did lots of arts and crafts projects and music. They really liked rhythm instruments, you, know, drums and maracas. Linda Rice was the music teacher and she came every day.

We had a hot plate in my class—the kids loved to use it for cooking. We played dress-up, made Play-Doh, and did a lot of singing...a *lot* of singing. We always did the clapping song and sang "Itsy Bitsy Spider" so much I think the spider grew exhausted!

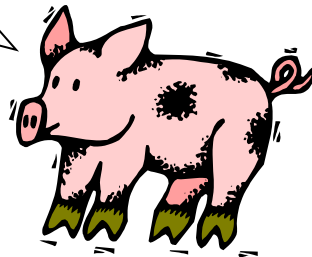

**THE HELEN WALTERS UNM SCHOLARSHIP**

In 1990, First Presbyterian Church member and former UNM Professor, Dr. Helen Walters, bequeathed \$36,000.00 to the church, the interest from which to provide scholarship funds for a church member or members enrolled full time in the University of New Mexico and maintaining a "B" average. These funds are managed by the First Presbyterian Church Foundation. The amount of each scholarship is dependent upon the number of members applying as well as market conditions, but if an application is approved, and the student maintains both a "B" average and submits timely transcript reports, the scholarship will continue until graduation.

In order for awards to be made in a timely fashion each semester, deadlines are set for receiving and processing applications and reports. Such deadlines are directly related to dates semesters start and end. **Deadline for applications for Fall Semester 2011 is June 1st, 2011.
